Subject: City Council Update

At the Study Session next Tuesday evening the spring semester group of architecture students along with two professors will be making a presentation to update Council on their progress toward the final product and work deliverables. They are very excited about this opportunity. Due to the large number of students we will hold our session in the Council Chamber rather than the conference room. They are scheduled to continue their presentation during the Presentations portion of the Council Agenda.

The first action item for your consideration is to approve an expenditure of funds in an amount not to exceed \$122,000 for utility relocation at our well field. This expenditure is required under Article 9 of our lease agreement with the Oklahoma City Airport Trust. It is anticipated that the cost will be just under \$120,000, however, this water line is really large (16") requiring several large fittings. We felt that we needed just a little contingency moving forward. It is the intention of the Airport Trust to extend Portland Ave. south onto Airport land to allow for commercial development adjacent to our well field. They anticipate the build-out to take 20 to 30 years.

The second action item is to consider an expenditure of funds in the amount of \$38,938.50 for sewer line bursting in the 300 block of Kimberly. As you are aware "line bursting" is the process of hydraulically pulling a continuous sleeve through the sewer line without having to trench. We have been experiencing problems in that area with collapsed and broken lines caused primarily by tree roots. This is a budgeted item. Between what has been done previously and this project we will have used most, but not all, of the amount budgeted for this fiscal year.

Action items 5, 5A, 5B, and 5C all relate to your consideration of proposed Ordinance No. 1287 relating to Animal Control within the City. Mike has taken the red-line suggestions provided by Nick and others and rewritten the ordinance to remove language "specific to" an animal such as feral cats. We really do need to update our animal control ordinance. The resolution relates to certain fees associated with animal control. "The devil is in the details" and the details are contained in the rules and regulations. It is time to vote either up or down. Either way, I think we all recognize the amount and high quality of work that Councilman McEachern has done on this issue.
