



CHANGES IN YOUR RESIDENTIAL TRASH SERVICE OUTLINED

The City of Yukon's Sanitation Services Dept. is undergoing dramatic change with three new side loader sanitation trucks. Yukon residential trash service will transition to an automated weekly pickup process, and will include these changes:

1. The side loader trucks will only empty City of Yukon issued trash carts that are compatible with the new automated truck requirements.
2. Trash bags outside of a cart or dumpster and any additional refuse placed at the curb will not be picked up as of **May 15**.
3. Customers having more trash than what one cart can hold may request a second cart free of charge. Request forms are available on the City of Yukon's official web site at www.cityofyukonok.gov/departments/sanitationservices, in the Yukon City Hall lobby at 500 W Main St., or by calling Sanitation Services at 354-4317.
4. Proper placement of your trash cart is important. An automated arm is located on the side of the truck which will pick up your cart, empty it into the trash truck and then return it to the ground. Please place the cart pointing toward the street with the wheels against the curb or edge of the pavement. Make sure that no vehicle is parked in front of the cart and that it has a clearance of three feet around it. There should be no overhead obstructions, such as tree limbs. Instructions are imprinted on the lid of the newly issued trash carts.



5. Customers having more trash than what two issued carts can hold have these options:
 - a. Take items to the Recycle Center
 - b. Utilize your free monthly dump at the Transfer Station. Present your current monthly bill payment stub with your driver's license.
 - c. Request additional carts. An extra monthly fee will be added to your utility bill if more than two carts are at your residence, even if we do not empty all of them every week.
 - d. Request a special curb side pickup as needed. A fee will be added to your monthly utility bill only when this service is provided.
6. The new side loader trucks follow routes that empty carts along one side of the street and return to empty the carts placed on the other side of the street.

7. There are two types of older issued blue or green carts that cannot be serviced by the automated new trucks, which are pictured here. If your cart is this type, please contact Sanitation Services at 354-4317 for a free replacement.



8. You can have up to two carts for the same monthly rate on your monthly utility bill. We will not empty more than two carts without charging an additional monthly fee.
9. Other Charges:
\$8.50 Monthly for each cart in addition to the first two free issued carts
\$25.00 Special Curb Side Pickup, charged per trip, up to 4 cubic yards (equivalent to two refrigerators) plus \$5.00 for each additional cubic yard.

Non-Hazardous Household Waste Only!

Place lightweight items into sealed bags to prevent blowing.

No fluids (which can leak onto street) like Oil, Antifreeze, Paint, Cooking Oil, Chemicals, or Pesticides.

No Hot Ashes (which can damage the cart), Rock, Cement, Gravel, Dirt, Pool Chemicals or Acids.

No State Regulated Medical Waste, TV's, Computer Monitors, Batteries, Fluorescent Lights

Nothing that weighs more than 200 lbs.

OG&E PLANS NEIGHBORHOOD TREE TRIMMING



The City of Yukon received notice recently that OG&E approved contractors will be in area neighborhoods pruning tree limbs and removing trees that are incompatible with power lines. The project's goal is to ensure safe, reliable electric services. The work is done at no charge to residents.

In general, small trees and brush that have come up on their own under the power lines will be removed. Large trees near power lines may be removed or trimmed to keep them away from the wires. Brush will be hauled away and wood will be cut to firewood length and stacked, unless otherwise specified.

Contractor representatives will be in neighborhoods before work begins to explain the planned tree work and answer questions. If a property owner is not present, a card will be left on the front door providing contact information.

OG&E offers these tips to prevent the need for tree trimming:

- Never plant trees directly beneath overhead wires or near poles or anchor wires.
- Small trees with a mature height of 15 feet or less may be planted within 5 feet of power lines.
- Medium sized trees with a mature height of 30 feet or less should be at least 30 feet away from power lines
- Large trees should be planted 50 feet or more from power lines.
