## 'Social butterfly' tot fights odds

■ Little girl diagnosed with rare and incurable brain cancer

A little girl whose parents call a "social butterfly" has been diagnosed with a rare and incurable brain tumor.

Shortly before Farrah Love turned two on April 25, doctors found the tumor in a part of her brain stem that renders nervous system function impossible. She is undergoing treatment

for the rare disease and her parents, Daxton and Jenna Sinclair, are praying for a miracle.

Jenna Sinclair is a professional counselor and works in the Mustang School District and offers family counseling services in Yukon.

The type of cancer afflicting Farrah

## Pro soccer coming to Yukon in 2015

■ Oklahoma City's new NASL franchise to call Miller Stadium home pending lease OK

Yukon Public Schools' Board of Education has taken a critical step forward in bringing the North American Soccer League (NASL) to Oklahoma City.

The Board at its Monday night meeting unanimously approved a resolution directing Superintendent Dr. Jason Simeroth to enter into a multiyear lease with Oklahoma City FC to host professional soccer games at Miller Stadium starting in spring 2015.

Dr. Simeroth said he is "very excited about this possibility," calling the arrangement a "win-win" for the expansion Oklahoma City FC franchise, the

## Employees jailed for alcohol sale to minor

■ Sheriff's Office serious about compliance

Two local retail employees were arrested and jailed while three others were later charged for selling alcohol to minors during recent undercover compliance checks.

Five of 40 businesses failed the checks conducted March 22 and April 11 at restaurants,

convenience stores, grocery stores, liquor stores, and pharmacies in Yukon and Mustang.

The compliance checks were conducted by Canadian County Sheriff's Office deputies. An Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement (ABLE) Commission agent joined

## YPS school farm regs earn Board approval

■ Milliron: Rules protect students, equipment

A list of rules and regulations for the Yukon vo-ag school farm were approved Monday night by Yukon Public Schools' Board of Education.

School Board members unanimously approved the Yukon FFA chapter school farm contract at the recommendation of

Yukon High School Principal Melissa Barlow and FFA advisor/vo-ag instructor Mitch Milliron.

"We have the greatest school farm in the state," said Milliron, pointing out that visitors often want to see the facilities during both daytime and evening. "We need to protect
